Broad definition of allowable uses -

- 1. Respond or mitigate the public health emergency with respect to the coronavirus disease or its negative economic impacts.
- 2. Cover costs incurred as a result of such emergency.
- 3. Replace revenue that was lost, delayed or decreased as determined based on projections of the government as of January 27, 2020, as a result of such emergency
- 4. or address negative economic impacts of such emergency.

Administration of the Funds -

- Fund administration will be running through the United States Treasury.
- There is NO DEADLINE on the use of the funds. Funds are available until expended.
- Entities would have to <u>provide a certification on the use or need of the funds to the Treasury</u>. Treasury has to make the payments within 60 days. (aka Not every entity gets a direct allocation, instead every entity has to apply for it.)
- GAO and the PRAC to conduct oversight over the whole package. IG still retains audit authority.
- Census data to be used is the most recent.
- Non CDBG entitlement communities (population less than 50,000) money flows through the State. State has 30 days to distribute. Non-entitlement community distribution is made by states based per capita.
